Commencement Speakers

I am very pleased to announce that we have two wonderful commencement speakers to inspire you at commencement. At the morning section of our commencement, our speaker will be Dr. Kim D. Harrington, Class of 1989. The Afternoon commencement speaker will be Ms. Gretchen Geitter, Class of 1991.

Dr. Harrington is the Associate Vice President for Arts, Belonging and Community, Student Engagement & Well-Being at Georgia Institute of Technology (Georgia Tech) in Atlanta, GA. She is a member of the Fredonia College Foundation Board of Directors.

Ms. Gretchen Geitter served the Buffalo Bills organization for 30 years, and from 2008 to her retirement in 2024, she served as Vice President of Community Relations. Her Bachelor of Science degree from SUNY Fredonia is in Communication. Ms. Geitter was the very first recipient of the Robert E. Coon Recognition Award, established through the Fredonia College Foundation, which is awarded to a student who shows excellence in the classroom and contributes significantly to student life.
